 Partners' Update Partners Gazette - We're working on the new edition of the Gazette which should be with residents in February. We're planning to include an ASB article as was suggested at the last Open Forum. Currently we've included articles on support during the cost-of-living crisis, energy saving tips, engagement register/open forum/chance to chat reminders. Are there any other topics residents would like to see included? Communal area letters - In September's meeting an attendee made a suggestion regarding the letters we send residents when we're aware of items in the communal areas. They suggested we add something to show that the letter was being sent because of one of our inspections rather than a neighbour notifying us of a problem. They suggested this would help minimise any potential neighbour issues. Our Housing Management Team have agreed to add something like 'Our regular communal area inspection has found items in the communal areas' Open Forum Attendees - Partners managers will be asked to book into one of this year's open forums and their attendance will be published for the year ahead. The Forum were asked whether there were any other non-Partners representatives they would be interested in hearing from? Conferencing Equipment - We have installed new conferencing equipment in our Board room which will enable hybrid meetings. In person and online delegates will be able to meet. This will be great for our in-person meetings if some residents would rather attend online. 	 Residents suggested information for the Gazette on keeping warm in your home and fuel poverty. Community groups such as ageUK and Let's talk were also suggested. We plan to have a mixture of in person and online Open Forum meetings this year. We anticipate that the in-person meetings will be during the summer and dates will be checked with attendees in advance to ensure that there is enough interest in attending.
